

GREENWOOD TOWNSHIP BOARD OF TRUSTEES
MINUTES OF JUNE 9, 2026

The meeting was called to order at 6:00pm by Supervisor Lindsey.

Board members present: Fred Lindsey - Supervisor, Diane Bissonette - Treasurer, Amy Lake - Clerk, Brandon Watson - Trustee and Annette Chalmers - Trustee.

Watson motioned to approve the agenda as written, second by Chalmers. All in favor.

Watson motioned to approve the minutes of May 12, 2026, second by Lake. All in favor.

Correspondence: None

Public Comment: Sharyn Scobie spoke concerning speeders passing recklessly on Tee Lake Road. She and two other residents are requesting to have Pass with Care signs placed in the vicinity of Tee Lake Road and Vacationland Drive and a double yellow line for no passing in the area. Tee Lake Road is posted 25 miles an hour. Lindsey stated the County Road Commission has jurisdiction over postings and lines, but he will speak with them. Commissioner McCauley suggested going to a Road Commission meeting to discuss the matter with them. McCauley stated that, as a commissioner, he has nothing to do with resolving this issue.

Clerk Report: Lake reported the distribution of \$10,131.48 from the Fire Department fund and the distribution of \$70,767.07 from the General Fund. Bissonette motioned to pay the bills, second by Lake. A roll call vote was taken with all voting in favor.

Treasurer Report: Bissonette reported the ending fund balance for all funds at \$419,286.07.

Supervisor Report: None.

Sheriff Report: None.

Fire Department Report: Chief Moll reported four calls for service during the month of May. Chief Moll and Training Officer Cochran attended a river rescue class. Cochran also attended a forcible entry class and an airport fire attack class. One training meeting was held. The ventilation fan has been ordered and the turnout gear for Firefighter Don McLain has been received.

Zoning Administrator Report: Zoning Administrator Ron Palmquist reported approval for seven zoning permits, one land division, one combination of property, one camping permit and one minor home occupation with sign. One nuisance violation notice and one zoning violation were sent out.

Planning Commission Report: The Planning Commission met on May 19th and continued their work on the Zoning Ordinance. They will be gathering information for roadside stands, accessory structures and special use for major home-based businesses. Their next meeting will be June 29, 2026 at 6:00pm.

Zoning Board of Appeals: The ZBA met on May 11th for a regularly scheduled meeting, with no case to discuss. It was reported that Tim Flanigan is resigning from the Board. Amy Lake motioned to accept the resignation, a second came from Bissonette. All in favor. A replacement will be needed for Mr. Flanigan. Their next meeting will be August 10, 2026 at 7:00pm.

Assessor Report: Lindsey read the report and stated that Greenwood Township received a perfect score on the PA 660 Audit with the next audit being in 2031. Lindsey stated Mr. Borowicz is doing a great job for the Township.

Commissioner Report: Continued discussion on Cherry Creek Road construction, the county is still hiring for summer help, repair work ongoing at the Sheriff Dept. and the Courthouse elevator.

Old Business: More discussion concerning radar or solar signs on Williams Rd. to slow traffic down. Watson spoke in favor of these but met some opposing opinions regarding the excessive cost. Kathy Podzikowski suggested that perhaps the Road Commission should just post a speed limit on Williams with a lower limit between Woodridge and Townline. Lindsey said the Road Commission is opposed to doing that.

New Business: Chief Moll requested funds to obtain an inflatable rescue boat for the Fire Department. After discussion by Board members, a roll call vote was taken with all voting in favor to approve \$2,500.00 for the purchase.

Public Comment: Brandi Nihranz spoke up saying the Sheriff Department has been providing a better presence in the area and has been issuing speeding tickets to help slow the traffic down. They should be encouraged to do their job and the need for signage may not be necessary. She stated that she is very grateful to Sheriff Kann and the department for doing such a good job. Many in attendance agreed.

Remarks from the Board: Chief Moll remarked, with all of the roads in the township receiving brine, for some reason, Pinewood and Pearl were missed.

Motion to adjourn by Lake, seconded by Watson at 6:42pm.

Next board meeting will be July 14, 2026 at 6:00pm.
